

	Rules
1.	That this society shall be called "The Kirkby Fleetham & District Floral and Horticultural Society".
2.	That the Society be managed by President, Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary and a committee of at least seven members.
3.	All sections open to all contestants. For trophy purposes, "local" is specified as living – Kirkby Fleetham, Fencote, Scruton, Killerby, Holtby, Langton, Leases and Kiplin.
4.	Entries to be made on the form provided and forms to be restricted to one entrant per form.
5.	All articles exhibited shall be bona-fide property of the exhibitor and of his/her growing, or shall have been in his/her possession not less than two months preceding the day of the show. Should any doubt arise as to false exhibiting, the exhibitor must allow his/her garden to be inspected either before the day of the show or before the payment of prize or prizes.
6.	Any person infringing these rules or otherwise imposing on the Society shall forfeit all prize and entry fees.
7.	Any person objecting to an exhibit or exhibitor to deposit £1 as proof of ground for objection. If the objection is held good the fee will be returned. If not, the fee will go to the Society Funds.
8.	The Committee cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
9.	Prizes to be awarded at the judges' discretion.
10.	The show tent will be open until 10.25 am to stage exhibits. All exhibits must therefore be in place an numbered by that time.
11.	Judging will commence immediately after the tent is cleared. No other person will be allow to enter until the tent is open to the public. The judges may withhold the prize or prizes if the exhibits are not of sufficient merit. The judge's decision is final.
12.	Vegetables must be clean. All fruit ripe and neatly displayed.
13.	The Exhibition will close at 5.00 pm after which time all the exhibitors will be allowed to remove their produce. Exhibits left behind after 5.30 pm will be sold.
14.	Prize money will be paid out from 3.00 pm. The committee will not hold themselves responsible for prizes after that time.
15.	Exhibitors found wrongly exhibiting or using abusive or band language to the judges or members of the committee will, on motion that the AGM of the Society, be debarred from again exhibiting at any future show.





Class 69 Recipe:



Cake Ingredients

	3	eggs
75	g	caster sugar
75	g	self-raising flour
2	tbsp	cocoa powder

Plus 1 tbsp caster sugar to sprinkle on parchment prior to first rolling up.

Slightly warmed jam for filling & sieved icing sugar to dust the finished swiss roll.

Method

Grease & pre-line a 12"x 9" swiss roll tin with baking parchment. Prepare rolling up parchment by sprinkling with 1 tbsp sugar. Pre-heat the oven to 180°C fan, 200°C conventional, gas mark 6.

- · Break eggs into the mixing bowl and add sugar.
- Whisk until thick & creamy.
- Sieve flour & cocoa powder into a separate bowl.
- Fold the flour & cocoa lightly into the egg & sugar mixture.
- Bake for 8-10 minutes until firm to touch.
- Turn out onto prepared parchment paper and remove the lining paper.
- Make a score mark 2.5cm in from the short edge, being careful not to cut right through.
- Place another smaller piece of parchment on top of cake. Roll from short end.
- When cool carefully unroll, remove inner parchment, add jam filling and re-roll.
